

FROM OUR PRAYER TEAM: RAMADAN PRAYERS

I have a friend who came to America from Saudi Arabia. On Monday I saw him briefly. I asked him if he was observing Ramadan. His face lit up. He was surprised that I even knew about Ramadan. He was pleased that I would ask. "Yes," he answered. Like all good Muslims, he is abstaining from food and drink between sunrise and sunset, for the whole month. Not even a drop of water is to be drunk during the daylight hours. This year, Ramadan begins with the crescent moon of March 18 and lasts until the crescent moon of April 18.

"What else are you supposed to be doing during Ramadan?," I asked.

"Reciting the prayers, reading the Quran and giving to charity."

"Are you reading the Quran?" At this he covered his face, smiled and shook his head.

"How do you know when you've done enough to please God?"

"Oh, you know. By the good things God gives you. Like my job."

I am praying for my friend. He is sincere, but lost. He is trying to earn God's favor by his good behavior. He needs Jesus. Ramadan is a time when Muslims are especially focused spiritually. It is a month when they expect that their good deeds will receive increased rewards from God.

I'm looking forward to further conversation with my friend. I'm looking forward to explaining to him that no amount of good deeds on my part can earn God's favor. Jesus has done for me what I cannot do for myself.

We don't all have Muslim friends. But we all have unsaved friends. I think our approach can be the same. We can show a genuine interest in their lives and in their beliefs. Ask good questions. Listen well. Show respect. Be ready to explain what we believe. Then pray. And leave the results to the Holy Spirit. I have learned that I cannot argue or trick anyone into the Kingdom of God.

But I can show genuine love and interest in a friend. I can share what the Bible says. And I can pray earnestly that God will open their hearts and minds.

"In your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect." (1 Peter 3:15)





HIEVERYONE

The corporate prayer on March 19th generated responses from a surprising number of people who heard it that morning. It must have touched a nerve, with many of you asking about the prayer itself and the book that the prayer came from. I am including the text of the prayer here as well as a link to the book, "The Valley of Vision"



from publisher The Banner of Truth Trust.

CORPORATE PRAYER, FAITH COMMUNITY CHURCH MARCH 19TH, 2023

Good morning.

May the grace and peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you!

You don't have to get into the Bible very far before you read about the enemy of God, the devil. He first reveals himself, as a serpent, in the third chapter of Genesis, and because of his hatred for God, and through lies and deceit, he brings about the fall of mankind. And even now, all around us, but unseen, the devil and his demons are actively waging war against God and anyone who is a follower of God.

Paul tells us in the 6th chapter of Ephesians that as followers of Christ we must be prepared for this spiritual battle.

Ephesians 6:11-13

11 Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. 12 For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. 13 Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm.

Here Paul draws back the curtain on reality, and he gives a peek, he gives us a glimpse, into the place where dark, and sinister demonic forces exist. He tells us to put on the full armor of God – you have to "suit up" to be a Christian here.

Why? Because Paul tells us that "our struggle is not against flesh and blood". We think, especially in the church, that our battle is with people, but Paul clearly tells us here that our battle is NOT against flesh and blood, but rather it is against principalities and powers, against the rulers of darkness in this world, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms.

He paints a picture of a highly sophisticated and organized rebellion against God. The Bible tells us that the devil is a real spirit being, and Jesus talked about the devil often. I know it's not popular in our culture to talk about the devil, and some people may think that you've lost your mind, but the devil is real. Jesus believed that he was real. Jesus confronted the forces of evil by casting out demons. The Bible even says that Jesus was tempted by the devil.

Now the devil was not omnipresent like God is, but in some sense, he doesn't have to be because in the rebellion spoken of in the Old Testament, he took 1/3 of the angels with him and they are focused, and they are intentional, and they are purposeful about doing one thing, and that is multiplying

disobedience to God. This is basically Ephesians chapter 2 verses 1 to 3 – creating more sons of disobedience that are in rebellion to God and that will follow the devil in this rebellion. There's a very real, spiritual battle that is going on all around us, and we are naive followers of Jesus if we don't recognize that.

So, if the enemy is all around us, and we are under attack, how do we combat this? We are told what to do in 1 Peter 5:8.

1 Peter 5:8-9

8 Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. 9 Resist him, firm in your faith, knowing that the same kinds of suffering are being experienced by your brotherhood throughout the world.

We need to be sober-minded. We need to be watchful. We need to resist him by being firm in our faith. So how do we do that? How can we be firm in our faith? We need to pursue and press into Jesus even harder. We need to be in God's Word. We need to pray. We need to talk to, and read about, the brothers and sisters who have been seasoned from being in the battle before us. I personally have found wisdom in the writings of the Puritans.

The Puritans acknowledged this spiritual battle and they took it seriously. Thankfully, we can be encouraged and strengthened by their faith as many of their writings survive. I have been personally experiencing some heavy spiritual attack, and this morning I would like to share a Puritan prayer that I came across in the book, "The Valley of Vision", which is a collection of Puritan prayers and devotions.

This prayer is titled "The Servant in Battle".

PLEASE PRAY WITH ME:

THE SERVANT IN BATTLE

O LORD.

I bless thee that the issue of the battle
between thyself and Satan has never been
uncertain, and will end in victory.
Calvary broke the dragon's head,
and I contend with a vanquished foe,
who with all his subtlety and strength has
already been overcome.

When I feel the serpent at my heel may I remember him whose heel was bruised, but who, when bruised, broke the devil's head.

My soul with inward joy extols the mighty conqueror.

Heal me of any wounds received in the great conflict;

if I have gathered defilement, if my faith has suffered damage, if my hope is less than bright, if my love is not fervent, if some creature-comfort occupies my heart, if my soul sinks under pressure of the fight.

O thou whose every promise is balm,
every touch life,
draw near to thy weary warrior,
refresh me, that I may rise again to wage the

and never tire until my enemy is trodden down. Give me such fellowship with thee that I may defy Satan, unbelief, the flesh, the world,

with delight that comes not from a creature, and which a creature cannot mar.

Give me a draught of the eternal fountain that lieth in thy immutable, everlasting love and decree.

Then shall my hand never weaken, my feet never stumble,

my sword never rest, my shield never rust, my helmet never shatter, my breastplate never fall,

as my strength rests in the power of thy might.

Father God, we lift this prayer to you in the victorious name of our Savior, Jesus Christ! Amen!
