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NEW SERMON SERIES

Starting September 13th

Christianity is strange. That's not an accident; it was designed that way. God established a people to represent Him to the rest of the world. And he calls them holy. The word holy means 'distinct,' set apart,' or 'different.' In other words, strange.

UGANDA

Sunday, October 4th at 1pm

The ministry in Uganda continues to grow. The investment FCC and the St. Croix Lead Team made in raising up men who understand the urgency of the Great Commission and who realize the importance of multiplicative disciple-making is translating into new churches being planted. These men are now training others who are catching the vision to plant healthy, biblical churches where there are currently none.



On April 29, Pastor Edwin of Kitgum Community Church posted this prayer for his pastor friend (pictured):

Pray for my dear friend, Pastor Denis, and his dear wife. He is on fire for the gospel to see every life transformed in his community. He is starting small groups in 3 locations leading to planting a healthy living church plant in his community— Latanya- Aloto village about 25km away from Kitgum town. While in our Healthy church training, the Holy Spirit convicted his heart with a big vision of community transformation- - He told me after he had gone home he couldn't sleep, thinking big trusting God to move in his life, making disciples that make disciples...



Fast forward to May 24th, and we see a small church gathering as the Aloto South Congregation in Latanya! And there have been at least 2 more churches planted since this time. But you notice that the churches are basically meeting outdoors. If they are fortunate, they may have a tree for shade and some protection from the rain. We want to help build churches!

Our **Missions Meal** is an opportunity for you to give specifically to help these young congregations build a shelter to meet under. Currently, there are 2 shelters needed for 2 new churches. If more is contributed than needed for these 2, the funds will be used for these pastors to continue to spread the gospel. It is such a joy to support the work God is doing across the world to bring lost people to salvation and to bring healthy, biblically sound churches into communities. Come hear more and rejoice in the work the Lord is doing!

SOUTH SUDAN

Pastor Taban Francis Delfin

In 2025, Faith Community Church began a partnership with Pastor Taban Francis, along with, Pastor Ayume Richard, and Pastor Ameku Godfrey, all of whom are pastoral graduates of Abaana's Hope Pastoral Training Center in Gulu, Uganda. With financial support from both FCC and a church in Alabama, these men will travel into South Sudan taking the TLI Biblical Pastoral training to pastors and leaders. Currently, they have finished training the first lesson to individuals in the communities of Mundri, Lui, and Yeri, with the 2nd lesson taught in August. The fourth community of Wandri, being too dangerous to be at the present time. These photos are from the training in Mundri, South Sudan.

CHUCK OLSON

Elder Candidate

My name is Chuck Olson, and I am a father of 5 of the most amazing kids God could have blessed me with! Charlie(22), Ava (21), Levi(19), Henry(16), & Sophia(7). I have been married to the love of my life Melissa for 25 glorious years. When I look back over my life, I see a story that is ultimately not about what I have accomplished, but about the faithfulness of God. -Ephesian 2: 8, 9

God began working in my life long before I recognized what He was doing. As a teenager, I experienced significant loss, and in the years that followed, I wandered far from God. I made many choices that led me down difficult paths, believing I could manage life on my own strength. Eventually, those choices led me through seasons of addiction and multiple treatment programs. During another difficult season, I found myself in treatment once again. While there, I discovered that I could leave on Sundays if I attended a church service. That became my opportunity to spend Sundays with Melissa and attend Faith Community Church, which at the time met in the local high school. As I listened to the teaching, something began to change in me. I heard the truth of God's Word communicated with both conviction and love, and I found myself drawn to it.

For the first time, I was beginning to see God differently. What I didn't realize at the time was that God had been preparing me for this moment all along. My story is certainly more complicated than this short version, but the central truth is simple: God met me in the middle of my brokenness, opened my eyes to the truth of the Gospel, and completely changed the direction of my life.



Looking back, I can see His hand throughout my entire story—even in the places where I didn't recognize Him. What I once viewed as a series of failures, God used as part of a story that ultimately brought me to Himself. And today, I have the incredible privilege of serving His Church and helping others hear the same Gospel that changed my life.

For more than a decade, God has allowed me to serve His Church in a variety of ministry roles. Through every season—growth and difficulty, change and stability, success and disappointment—I have continued to come back to the same conviction: Jesus Christ is worthy of our lives, and the local church is worth giving ourselves to.

I love seeing people grow in Christ, and to help equip others to make disciples who make disciples – who make disciples – who make disciples – who make disciples...

My formal ministry training began at Northwestern College in St. Paul, Minnesota, where I earned a Bachelor of Arts in Ministry in 2011, with a minor in Family Counseling. But ministry has never simply been about a degree or a position for me. I have always been drawn toward people—to understand them, walk alongside them, help them through difficult seasons, and point them toward the truth and hope found in Jesus Christ.

Over the years, that calling has taken many different forms. In 2011, I stepped into church planting ministry in Prescott, Wisconsin, where I served as a church planter from 2011-2013. That season taught me much about the difficulty, sacrifice, dependence upon God, and joy involved in building something for the sake of the Gospel.

In 2013, I returned to Faith Community Church in New Richmond, Wisconsin, where I served as Youth Director from 2013-2017. Working with students deepened my conviction that ministry is ultimately about people, not programs. Young people need adults who will love them, teach them God's Word, challenge them to follow Christ, and walk with them through real life.

SMALL GROUP MINISTRY

The New Testament is full of "one-anothers." To scratch the surface, we are to "love one another" (Jn 13 & 15), "outdo one another in showing honor" (Rom 12:10), "Greet one another" (Rom 16:16), "welcome one another" (Rom 15:7), "show hospitality to one another" (1 Pet 4:9), "have fellowship with one another" (1 Jn 1:7), "agree with one another" (2 Cor 13:11), "live in harmony with one another" (Rom 12:16), "be at peace with one another" (Mark 9:50), "be kind to one another" (Eph 4:32), "forgive one another" (Eph 4:32)... You get the picture! We could fill several pages with the "one anothers" of Scripture.

Needless to say, it is difficult (impossible) to practice the "one-anothers" of Scripture if we don't "know" one another- and know one another at a deep level. (E.g. If you're going to "forgive one another" you need to get close enough to someone for them to sin against you; and vice-versa.) Scripture assumes that as Christians we will live life together; not as sanctified acquaintances, but as family. The gospel is thicker than blood (Matt 12:48).

God has been blessing our church with new members and new attenders - praise the LORD! But remember, as we grow, it's going to be all the more vital to make sure that your relationships aren't a mile wide and an inch deep (Prov 18:24). That will take intentionality. Joining a small group is a great intentional step towards fostering deep, Christ-centered relationships. If you have any questions about small groups, please don't hesitate to reach out! 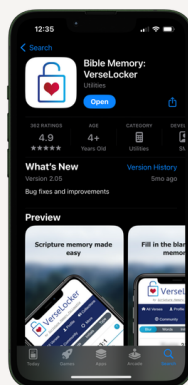

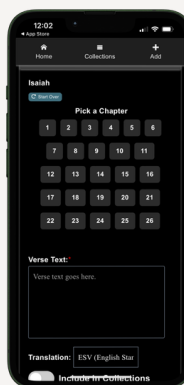

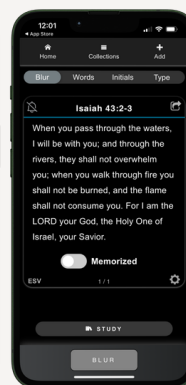
