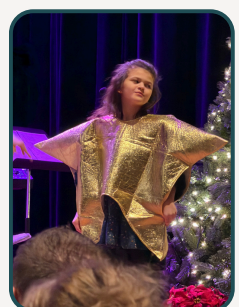
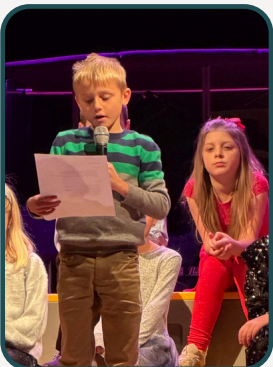

I find that serving in the nursery is a blessing to families because I do not have to deal with fussy babies or toddlers on a daily basis anymore....what a blessing I can be to these families to give them an opportunity to focus and grow closer to God without distractions while knowing their child is safe! It really is a small commitment with a huge benefit for families in our church! Many hands make light work but the result is a huge blessing to our church family.

WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY

Spiritual Mothering: Building Titus 2 Relationships That Last

This winter, our women's ministry is launching a new study called Spiritual Mothering, offered both in the morning and evening to make it accessible for every woman. Whether you're brand-new to Bible studies or have been part of women's ministry for years, this class is designed to help you step into the kind of life-giving relationships Scripture calls us to in Titus 2.

Titus 2 reminds us that all women—no matter our age or season—have a place in God's design for discipleship. Every woman is "older" to someone and "younger" to someone else. We are called to teach what is good, encourage one another, and walk together in God's Word. Spiritual Mothering is simply a way to help us live that out intentionally.

This study has three main goals:

1. **To equip women to confidently step into the role of "the older woman."** Not because we have all the answers, but because God uses ordinary faithfulness to shape the lives of others.
2. To bring older and younger women together in relationships that extend beyond the classroom. **Our hope is that the connections formed during these weeks will continue—over coffee, in prayer, in shared studies, and in everyday life.**
3. To glorify God by cultivating a culture of encouragement, wisdom, and spiritual growth among women.

Each week, we'll spend time in both Scripture and using "Spiritual Mothering" by Susan Hunt as a secondary resource to help guide our conversations. The heart of the class is not a program—it's people. It's women coming together to learn, listen, and grow side by side.

Also, the exciting possibilities for ongoing encouragement are endless. An older woman may connect with a few younger moms who want to walk through a biblical parenting study together. A group of single women may discover a shared desire to explore what it means to be complete in Christ and serve His body wholeheartedly. Others may simply find a friend to pray with, study with, or share life with.

If you've ever longed for deeper connection, for someone to walk with you, or for a place to pour into another woman, this study is for you. You don't need to be a certain age, have a certain personality, or feel like you "have it all together." You just need a willing heart.

We would love for you to join us as we pursue Christ together and build relationships that reflect His love and faithfulness.

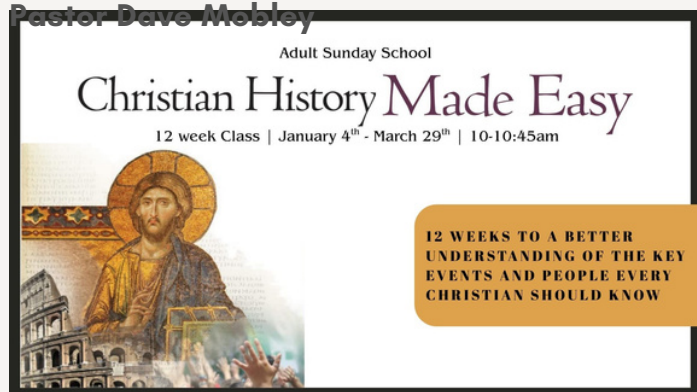

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

A Simple Gift-filled Shoebox...a Gospel Opportunity...the Planting of Churches!

FCC's shoebox gifts are on the way to the child that God has already chosen to receive each one of our shoebox gifts. What countries will our gifts go to? Stay tuned for more information. In the meantime, let's travel to two OCC shoebox gift receiving countries for Gospel Impact stories.

The Gospel Impact in Benin:

The West African nation of Benin is bordered by Togo, Nigeria, Burkina Faso, and Niger, has a population of 14.46 million people (World Bank, 2024). Benin has one of the youngest populations in the world, with a median age of just 18, and more than 41% of the population under 15 years old. This presents a remarkable opportunity for the Gospel, aligning strongly with OCC's mission to reach children with hope.

Benin is known as one of the rare countries in the World to have a week devoted to celebrating the occults. And thus, creating an opportunity and urgency for the OCC Ministry to reach out the nearly 35% of population adherent to ethnic and pagan religion.

The National Leadership volunteer teams in Benin continue to expand into rural and urban areas alike, empowering churches to disciple the next generation and reaching unreached regions and people groups including communities deeply rooted in Vodun and shamanism.

More than 1,000 churches documented, have started through the Operation Christmas Child Gift boxes in Benin.



Spiritual Impact Story - Mongolia Taiga - Ministry Among the Tsaatan People

A team of five traveled to serve the Tsaatan reindeer-herding families in the remote Eastern Taiga - a journey requiring 22 hours by car and 17 hours on horseback due to heavy supplies. The team brought 30+ shoebox gifts for the children of approximately 20 families living in this isolated region. They taught The Greatest Journey, and over 20 children graduated from this 12-lesson discipleship program.

At the beginning, the children were quiet and sad, but by the graduation celebration of The Greatest Journey discipleship program, they were joyful, connected, and expressive. The team rejoices in the joy God brought to these children.

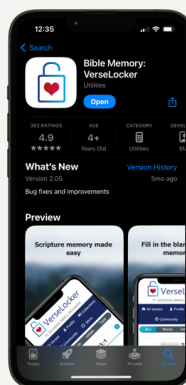

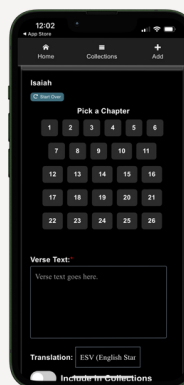

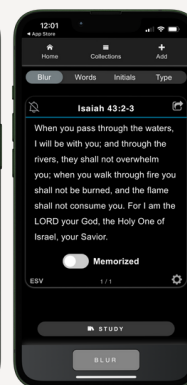
