TURKEY BASKET PARTNERSHIP

5Loaves Food Shelf

Faith Community exists to honor God while we make Disciples who plant the church! We have been presented a HUGE opportunity to partner with 5Loaves Food Shelf and “be a significant influence in our community”.

As most of you know, we have currently started an Outreach team that will focus on this very important Core Value. We are always looking, praying, and talking through how we, as a church, can help connect the Body to the Community. This is where you enter!!

On November 15th we plan to serve 115 families. These families currently use the 5Loaves resource and we get to give them the ingredients for a Thanksgiving Meal to take home and prepare. This will be a partnership between Faith Community and 5Loaves in which we (FCC) will be purchasing 115 turkeys, 130 pies, and 130 rolls, and 5Loaves will provide the rest: stuffing, green beans, cream of mushroom soup, corn, raisins, potatoes, plums, and a voucher to Kwik Trip for milk. We will assemble the meals inside the church, and then welcome these folks in the community to our building from 10:00am-12:00pm on November 15 to hand them out. We will pray with them. We will share the Gospel. We will invite them to join us on Sunday mornings, and we will give them an invite to our Christmas services.

Here is how you can help.

2. Also, we are looking to “support a meal” financially. There is a drop down tab on the Give portion of the [website](#) that you can help us with. We are looking for \$25 a meal. This will be an investment into these families and through using this as a vehicle to proclaim the Truth we are trusting that God will continue the work He has started!!!





Session 2: "What Makes A Man?"

What makes a man? The apostle Paul exhorts us in 1 Corinthians 16:13- "...act like men...!" What does that mean? We must "be" before we can "act."

Our present culture refers to masculinity as Toxic. Many are calling fatherlessness an epidemic. Many young men are reacting to the confusion over manliness by listening to worldly understandings which are far from what God designed and desires for us.

Beginning November 9 we will start a series entitled, "What Makes A Man?" where we will explore what it means to be God's man and not a "real man" based on family tradition or world centered views. We will talk about steps we need to take as men so that we can be all our Savior wants us to be in our homes, church, and community. You won't want to miss this class.

Book Recommendation

GENTLE AND LOWLY

The Heart of Christ for Sinners and Sufferers

I first read the book, "Gentle and Lowly: The Heart of Christ for Sinners and Sufferers" by Dane Ortlund back in 2020 when it was released. I have to admit that I read it with a lot of hesitation, coming at it as someone who can often doubt God's compassion and love to me in the midst of sin and failures. I found it comforting, especially in the confusing season of Covid - even recommending it to other Christians I knew that were going through times of suffering - but I also continued to hold the teaching of this book with apprehension.


When a trusted pastor recently asked me to read it again and consider reviewing it, I was thankful to come at it with a softer heart. Still prayerfully holding it up to Scripture but not letting my own weaknesses blur my view. Ortlund recognizes this tension in the book, "The Christian life...is the long journey of letting our natural assumption about who God is... fall away, being slowly replaced with God's own insistence on who He is. This is hard work. It takes a lot of sermons and a lot of suffering to believe God's deepest heart is 'merciful and gracious, slow to anger.'" (pg 151)

Ortlund uses Jesus' description in Matthew 11:29, "for I am gentle and lowly in heart", along with Puritan voices, past theologians and Scripture to confront fearful believers with who Christ is for them, mainly in their mess. He is cautious to point out, "This is not who He is to everyone, indiscriminately. This is who He is for those who come to Him [those in Christ], who take His yoke upon them, who cry to Him for help...for the penitent, His heart of gentle embrace is never out-matched by our sins and foibles and insecurities and doubts and anxieties and failures." (pg 21)

Each of the twenty-three chapters is based on a key bible verse to ponder. Though the chapters are tiny, I found them profound. Subjects such as "An Advocate", "The Emotional Life of Christ", "Why The Spirit?" and "Father of Mercies". Ortlund is a warm and eloquent communicator - the further I read, the more I wanted to read. This is a great book for those with busy schedules or even those who don't love to read.


"Gentle and Lowly" will help you behold Christ. I encourage everyone to read this book but especially those, who like me, battle to live and believe in God's heart for His children. For those who are bent toward knowledge and facts but tend to miss out on delighting in our tender and welcoming Savior. "The whole reason we care about sound doctrine is for the sake of preserving God's beauty, just as the whole reason we care about effective focal lenses on a camera is to capture with precision the beauty we photograph." (pg 99)


