FINANCIAL UPDATE | ED DOMENZAIN (speaking for Ron Hansen as he is on vacation)

- Our budget continues to look good. No concerns.
- Mortgage has \$398,000 left.

ELDER UPDATE | ALL ELDERS

- Introduced Bryan Stangl as an Official Elder. He was prayed over by the Elders and with the Church members.
- Tutapona: Steve Langer announced that we were making sure all of our missions align with our mission statement of "making disciples who plant the church". That being said, it has been decided to discontinue our financial support as a church for Tutapona. We will still provide donations over the next 4 years, decreasing 25% each year. Steve encouraged everyone to still give to them personally and reiterated how much we love them.
- Steve Langer announced that Sonshine Learning Center (who is currently renting the KidZone area of our building) has started construction of their new building which will take roughly 9 months.
- The Elders gathered last week to discuss future plans. Steve went through some of the items that were discussed, and what their future plan looks like:
- 1. Bible Literacy
 - Generate an elders statements/papers on gender, sexuality, marriage, and biblical roles
 - Generate an elders statements/papers on missions
 - o Start adult Sunday School classes.
 - Using Pastor Patrick's books for small groups.
- 2. Kid's/ Youth Ministry
 - Begin Sunday School (once we have access to the Sonshine side of our building again, we will work that into our Sunday routine)
 - Find a youth director (Matt T is doing great, but has found he doesn't have the time to continue. We are looking to hire someone for next year)
- 3. Men's Ministry
 - o Find the Men's ministry leader.
 - Have two intentional events. (e.g. Wild game night, Men's weekend retreat)
 - Teach on specific subjects that are vital to biblical manhood.
 - How do I follow God as man?
 - How do I disciple my family?
 - How do I love my wife?
 - How do I discipline my kids?

Prayer Team - Peter Bergeson:

The Prayer Team led by Peter Bergeson consists of more than two dozen FCC individuals committed to praying for God's power, love and glory to be displayed in and through each part of the church family.

We do this through:

· <u>Praver Corners</u>:

At the close of each Sunday morning worship service, members of our team are available to pray with anyone who comes forward with a need or a concern.

· Prayer Chain:

· <u>Weekly Prayer Gathering:</u>

Each Sunday morning we host a time of prayer for our church, our leaders our missionaries and our activities. We also pray for any specific needs we are aware of. This time is open to everyone, not just members of the Prayer Team. We meet in Classroom D-3 at 8:00 AM each Sunday.

Every quarter we plan and lead a time for the whole FCC family to gather to sing praise to God and to seek his filling, direction and healing for us as individuals and as a church body. In January, this emphasis took place in our Small Groups.

Womens Ministry - Stephanie Langer:

Goals for this year include

- 1) Revisit and update the Mission, Vision, and Values of the Women's Ministry to ensure that we are beginning with the foundation of the Gospel and building the ministry from there in all we do.
- 2) Connect with the women who have completed mentor training and are either leading groups or waiting for ladies to mentor for the purpose of ensuring that we are grounded in the Gospel and intentionally and accurately sharing the Gospel within our groups.
- 3) Create a succession plan for the leader of the Women's Ministry by year end 2024. I pray that God will call a woman who will come alongside me to be mentored and trained to take over as Women's Ministry Leader by November 1, 2026.

CHAOS - Matt Tunistra:

We just finished our quick study in the book of Philippians. We focused on finding Godly joy in every circumstance.

To close out the year with Chaos, we will be working through Lifeway resources curriculum for the Gospel Project. Faith Training - Dave Mobley:

During these months since I began to serve as the Faith Training Ministry Leader, I have had time to consider how Adult Education classes best function alongside our mission and ministries. I have identified 4 major areas that comprise the Faith Training Leader's areas of emphasis.

- 1. Identify teachers in our church body.
- 2. Equip teachers
- 3. Encourage teachers.
- 4. Identify curriculum in collaboration with Elders, Staff, Ministry Team, and Small group leaders.

The local church is built up when teachers are identified and have an opportunity to teach. Some may need more hands on equipping while others may need resources or administrative assistance. All will need to be encouraged. There is no Faith Training without teachers.

But a close second is the overall scope of curriculum. I do not believe this is a one man decision but rather a collaborative effort. Pastor, Elders, Staff, Small group leaders, and the Ministry Team should give input. One example would be that a small group leader wants to have his small group take a class on how to study the bible. The FTraining leader would then work to provide a class and teacher to meet that need. In this way the Faith Training classes work alongside our church to help make disciples who plant the church.

Words of encouragement from Faith Community Church Small Groups Feb 2024

Our group has been together for more years than I can remember. Last fall, it looked like our group would be coming to an end. There's been some changes in members' lives (good changes) over the last year that I thought might send members in a different direction. When I sent the invites out for starting back up last fall it surprised me that everyone was ready to start back up. Since then, we have had a new member join. This has shown me that despite how I feel or perceive things, God is always working in the background for his good. I was feeling the study group had run its course. God showed me that the work isn't complete. I help to encourage all to lead faithfully by God's guidance. Pray for guidance and be obedience let him lead, and he will. Be reminded that God's plan is not our plan. This has been shown to me so many times over. May God bless you all. (Ephesians 2:10 For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.)

One of our group members has a wife with Dementia. He has shared their struggles and the struggle of placing her in a nursing home. Recently, they've had an opportunity to move into a facility in New Richmond. This has been a bit of a process and there was a low percentage of her getting a bed in that facility. Through much prayer and work on his end, they are now in that facility. He has been very grateful for the support and is so excited that she is now closer and being well taken care of.

We have gained 3 new members recently! We are quite excited to hear new voices and worship with new believers. While winter isn't always easy to meet, our group has been fairly consistent, and we are getting used to knowing each other. Praise God for believers!

Our group has a great mix of old timers and newcomers, with several new people joining our group in 2023. I am amazed on a weekly basis of how God uses his people to encourage and strengthen our small group, and how he uses us to bless others in our church family. In 2023 we have had several group members, and immediate family members, with health issues and the many ways our group members have cared for each other with prayer, meals and encouragement is overwhelming.

So blessed by our small group and thankful for each one. Love the servant hearts and how each one cares for another. Was also incredibly blessed by the week of prayer and committing our entire small group meeting that week to prayer. We plan to do it once per quarter.

In our Group we write down our Prayer Requests each week. Looking back over several years we can see where so many of our prayers have been answered in God's loving kindness; for surgeries to be successful, for cancers to disappear, for children and grandchildren to accept Jesus into their lives, for God to guide someone's life in a job search - God has been so abundant in so many ways in His Grace and Goodness and Mercy and Love!
