RESURRECTION EGG KIT

How long have you been serving in Children's Ministry?

Which position do you currently serve in?

I serve as the co-teacher of 4th and 5th grade Sunday School.

Why do you think Children's Ministry is important?

I can't even begin to tell you how much I was shaped by and encouraged through children's ministry as a kid. In tandem with at home organic discipleship, it sets the foundation for a child's entire worldview, and how they view God is often contrived from what they hear in church--something about the setting and environment perhaps that just adds weight.

It's so important to raise up the next generation of the church. Often times children's ministry is seen as a way to just keep the kids entertained. You are not there to entertain them--though we have our share of fun! But if you are serious about the gospel, and wanting to instill truth into the minds of your next gen of church leaders, members of society and so forth--then buckle up for the joy of a lifetime. It is so rewarding to see these kids with minds made for God grasp His love for them and His eternal purposes for their lives. What are you waiting for?

GROWING TOGETHER

A New Ministry Launch

Growing Together is a new ministry designed to cultivate meaningful, intergenerational relationships between spiritually mature women and the girls in our youth ministry. The heart behind this launch is simple: our girls thrive when they are surrounded by women who model steady faith, prayer, and Christlike encouragement.

Growing Together pairs each participating woman one-on-one with a girl in the youth ministry, creating space for prayer, presence, and genuine connection. This is not a heavy program — it's a ministry of availability and intentional care. Women receive guidance, structure, and ongoing support so they feel equipped and confident. The goal is to help our girls feel seen, rooted, and supported as they grow in their walk with Jesus.

We are excited to see how God will use these relationships to strengthen both our youth and our women, building a community where faith is shared, nurtured, and lived out together.

New Event Coordinator





OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD



Globally, 12,205,900 shoebox gifts were collected during the 2025 collection season. Here in our area, we collected 12,220 shoebox gifts. Faith Community's shoebox gifts will take the Gospel to at least 7 different countries/areas of the world in 2026! Trinidad & Tobago is one of those countries.



TRINIDAD & TOBAGO

- Although 2/3 of the population professes Christianity, only about 20% are true disciples.
- 20% of the population is under age 15
- Barriers to the gospel are nominalism, witchcraft, Afro-Spiritist beliefs, and Hindu-influenced worldviews.
- Pray that the truth of the gospel would transform hearts and lives!

Testimony from Trinidad & Tobago: *After a shoebox distribution in Trinidad and Tobago, parents as well as children were interested in learning more about Jesus. So, local believers rented a vacant piece of land to hold church services. The services grew from one to three times a week. A church was planted there that continues to share the Word of God in its community.*

God is on the move in Kitgum Uganda. Our church family, through the mission budget, purchased 60 more Bibles for Kitgum Community Church in Kitgum, Uganda. Pastor Edwin will use these Bibles for new believers that are being discipled through his church. Edwin needed both English language Bibles and Acholi, which is a native language spoken in that region of Uganda.



Edwin borrowed a motorcycle to make the drive to Gulu and pick up the Bibles. He and his wife, Evelyn, are overjoyed with God's goodness.

Outreach - Faith Loves

OUTREACH TEAM IS LEADING FAITH LOVES

As Christians, we are called to advance the Gospel. As an Outreach Team, we are supporting opportunities for interaction that allow individuals to engage in "missional work." Some of you read "missional work" and think of an experience outside of our community that you have seen or participated in. I have no doubt that it was missional. I also want to remind you that your mission field also includes the people you interact with every day!

To help foster opportunities to advance the Gospel, the Outreach Team is starting Faith Loves.

There are two ways in which we bring pleasure to God. We can worship him and love others. Faith Loves is a ministry designed to connect people with skills to those who need help. The people needing help may be members of our church, but they may be your neighbor. Are you familiar with any of these scenarios?

- A single mother of two looks at a burned-out light bulb that should illuminate her way down the steps to the basement, but she cannot reach it to change it.
- A set of grandparents looks at their computer screen, wondering why it keeps locking up.
- Who can I get to install this grab bar, an elderly widow wonders.



Adult Sunday School

FROM PASTOR DAVE

Deacon of Adult Sunday School

I wanted to highlight a few firsts for Faith Training, commonly known as Adult Sunday School. Last session we offered 3 classes for adults for the first time! One of those was a book study entitled "7 Myths of Singleness" by Sam Alberry. I asked one member of the group, Kathryn Turner, to tell me what she thought of the group class. Below is a very thoughtful reflection of her experience in the class, but even more, how it feels to be single in a local church.

When I personally read the book, I concluded that it was good for me to understand our single brothers and sisters and love them well. I also believe it would be good for all of us at FCC.

During our final class, I asked one question: *What is one thing you would like the church to know about singleness?* Many thoughtful and honest responses were shared, but a consistent theme emerged: a deep desire for understanding and genuine community.

Many singles long to be understood with empathy. Most people truly mean well, yet even well-intentioned comments can sometimes feel dismissive. Statements like, "Marriage is harder," assumptions about unlimited availability, or quick advice such as, "You'll find someone when you least expect it," can unintentionally minimize the real challenges that come with being single and especially so for those living alone.

Singleness is not a deficiency or a waiting room for "real life" to begin. People are single for many reasons, by desire, by calling, or by circumstance, but none of those paths fall outside the sovereignty and goodness of God. In 1 Corinthians 7, Paul speaks of both marriage and singleness as gifts. Different? Yes. But both can reflect wholehearted devotion to the Lord.

We are not divided into categories within the Church. We are one body (1 Corinthians 12:12). Married and single believers share the same foundation and the same calling: to follow Jesus faithfully. When one part of the body feels unseen, we all feel it. When one part is strengthened, we all benefit.

SINGLES CLASS RECAP

From Kathryn Turner:

In February, we concluded our six-week Sunday School class led by Karl and Stephanie Anderson, where we walked through "The Seven Myths About Singleness" by Sam Allberry. While the topic centers on singleness, this is a book that both single and married believers would benefit from reading, as it challenges assumptions and encourages a more biblical view of community and calling. Each week we discussed one "myth" together, and it became a meaningful time of fellowship and connection. We talked honestly about the highs and lows of singleness, how it impacts our daily lives, our sense of community, and our service in the Kingdom, and how it can truly be a gift from God, whether it is a temporary season or a lifelong calling.

Adult Sunday School

To the singles in our church:

Be intentional about pursuing community. Join a small group. Serve. Participate in Bible studies. Seek mentorship. Don't be afraid to reach out first. Thank God for the season He has you in right now. Rather than living in the "what ifs" of the future, look for how you can serve and grow exactly where He has placed you. As Paul reminds us, we are called to contentment in every circumstance (Philippians 4:11-13).

To the married members of our church:

Check in on the singles around you. A simple text or phone call can communicate care more than you realize. Invite singles into your everyday life - not just scheduled coffee dates, but family dinners, holidays, and even the chaos of bedtime routines. If a single friend shares something difficult, be quick to listen and slow to speak. Ask before offering advice. Sometimes the greatest gift is simply being heard.

And personally, I am grateful for the honesty that was shared in this class. It reminded me that none of us walk perfectly through our season of life, married or single. We all carry joys and struggles that others may not fully see. My hope is not that we would categorize ourselves more carefully, but that we would draw closer to one another. That we would ask better questions. That we would assume the best. That we would choose presence over comparison.

We are one body. Different stories. Same Savior. May we continue learning how to care for one another in a way that reflects Him well.




CURRENT CLASSES

NEED PRAYER?

Your Christian brothers and sisters are ready and willing to lift up your requests before God in prayer. Here are some ways you can access that prayer:

- At the close of the Sunday worship service, step up to a front corner, under the cross or the exit sign. There you will find a person or two ready to listen to your request and pray for you.
- Fill out the Prayer Request form that you will find in the weekly bulletin. Drop this in the offering slot near the entrance door to the worship area. These requests will be forwarded to the Prayer Chain or only to Pastors/Elders as you direct.
- Go to the FCC website and look for the Prayer button.

- Share your request with your Small Group friends and ask them to pray for you.



CAN YOU PRAY?

Here are some opportunities to join other prayer warriors in asking God to expand his kingdom and to bless his people:

- In the Armory. We meet each Sunday morning at 7:30 AM. We pray for the worship service, the classes and all that goes on in our building. We pray for other churches and ministries. We pray for personal needs. No sign-up required. Just show up. The Armory is in the far south corner of the building.


