If you would like to stretch your food budget, RUBY'S PANTRY, a faith-based non-profit food ministry, provides a Pop-Up-Pantry (PUP) the third Thursday of every month at the New Richmond National Guard Armory. There are no residential requirements. Everyone who eats is eligible and no one is turned away. With a \$25 requested donation for each bundle, an abundance of food is received. Express Track Reservation is available up to 5pm the day before each PUP. Doors open at 4pm and distribution runs from 4:30-6:00pm.
