AN UPDATE TO GHURCH AND SUPPORTERS

Charlie Gess Mexico Caravan Ministries July 1, 2023

Hey everyone, I just wanted to reach out to all the people supporting me and provide a little information into everything that is going on down in Tijuana! Right now, it is Saturday, and we always have today off, so we just went to the city center and got some coffee (sat in some traffic) and got back to do some devotionals and reading. So far, it has been an amazing time, and I am so grateful I have all of you supporting me to make it possible. Since being at MCM I have grown so much in my faith, character, and knowledge of my savior.

There has certainly been amazing moments of fun and fellowship, but I want to share a few key concepts that really convicted me and I think will be eye-opening for a few of you as well.

1. Obedience

The first topic the speakers addressed that struck me were the ideas of obedience in our life. Oftentimes, we can get caught up in trying to do what is right for the Lord, without letting go of our grip on this life. We can get so caught up within everyday life and lose our eternal mindset. Most of us know there are some major ways in our life we still need to fully commit to the Lord, yet we think if we can avoid that one big thing and just obey some of the easier commands, we are being obedient. The quote that hit home was that "halfway obedience is simply disobedience" (pretty sure it was Spencer who said that). A perfect example of this is the rich young ruler.

He followed every rule, yet simply could not follow Christ and give up all his possessions. Whether this is loosening your grip on your financial situation, on your time, or even your plans, God is not looking for some of your reliance but all of it. A few practical ways that I am trying to work on are keeping the Sabbath holy, being more generous, and devoting my plans to Christ and whatever He has for that.

2. Direction and a call

The next major idea that made it into my journal a few times was the fact that almost everyone is praying for direction or a call in their lives. But did you know you can actually figure out your "call" pretty darn easily? There are two types of calls, an internal call and external call. The internal call comes from the Bible and reading scripture daily and understanding the will of the Father. This internal call is then confirmed by the external call of the church body and other members of Christ (it is extremely important the external call is not confirmed by random friends and people you might trust, because if you search long enough someone will always confirm what you are doing). Therefore, read your Bible consistently and understand the heart of your heavenly Father and confirm that with the external call of the church. This is the way in which the Holy Spirit often works.

3. Love

Lastly, something I discovered as a unifying theme throughout almost every message and Bible reading is love. Would you guess that? Seems pretty obvious. I could so easily get entangled within all the work I am doing I forget why I am doing it. Building houses for pretty poor families is a great thing but 1 Corinthians 13:1–3 is crystal clear that if we do not have love we are pointless, our words are pointless, and our actions are pointless, even if they are amazing! This is honestly very difficult. I probably smash my hand with a hammer at least six times a build and get frustrated with the speed of the project because it is a million degrees (only like 80 degrees by the grace of God, which is still way too hot) and I am hungry, but I need to remember that I am doing it because I love the Lord and I love what he loves. This is such an easy trap to fall into, so I would encourage you to all pray for a desire to be reminded consistently by the Spirit of your 'why' behind your actions.

Go into every situation with a loving spirit. Give lovingly, take out the trash lovingly, do your work, your school, emails, phone calls, serving, eating, and disciplining, do it all with love; for if you have no love, you gain nothing.

Thanks for reading that, and if you didn't thank you for supporting me anyway! I know it was not the easiest thing to sacrifice your time, prayer, and finances, but you have all done so incredibly lovingly and I am greatly encouraged by that. Being at MCM has realigned my perspective on this earth towards the Lord and I am so thankful you all supported me and got me here. After my time at MCM (absolutely wild to think I am halfway done already), I am heading back to the University of Northwestern St. Paul to get butchered by soccer tryouts and pursue a business degree. I have had a lot of doubts about why I would get a business degree, but God has had a plan throughout all of it. To get the Gospel into any of the closed off countries right now, it is imperative to go into these countries and regions with a business concept. I look to hopefully graduate in 2025 and will most likely be heading to Ethnos 360, which is a missionary training school. Afterwards I look forward to going wherever Christ might be most glorified.

As I look forward to all that God has in store for me, I am really challenged by the fact that I need to have love be the motive behind all my actions, desires, and goals. I have fallen short of this so much this summer but have also grown so much by focusing on this challenge.

Please continue to pray that I can keep this mindset in order to bring glory to God alone by lovingly serving all those I encounter. Additionally, I would love if you could be praying for health for all the staff, we have been getting sick a lot which is not fun. Lastly, prayers for continual loosening of my grip and hopefully yours on this fleeting life which we often grip so tightly onto. We are people who have been bought by the blood of Christ and our time and plans are now fully His now that He owns us!

Thank you all, I am so blessed to have such a strong foundation in Christ which I can depend on!



search team update

LEAD PASTOR SEARCH TEAM UPDATE

Hey church family! Just wanted to give a quick update on where things stand with our search. As of July 21st, we had around 130 applicants for our pastoral posting. Of those 130, about 24 of them entered the interview process with Chemistry Staffing. Of that 24, 6 of them were potential candidates.

A word of caution was shared with us about that number of six, with the way the process is set-up with Chemistry Staffing it can change daily. Candidates can apply and be quickly moved into that candidate pool, or they can be moved out of the candidate pool as they go through the various interviews required for candidacy.

Chemistry Staffing requires three interviews with their staff prior to an application becoming a viable candidate for our church. They compare them to our church profile. They evaluate things like, theology, personality, culture, skill, and several other criteria. In fact, there are 125 data points that they try and match between the candidate and our church. Their goal is to surface a pastor who will be with our congregation for at least the next 5-10 years.

Back to that number of six and the caution surrounding it, once a candidate emerges from that group. The candidate will prepare a written packet and submit that to the search team. We are committed to having a minimum of 2 conversations with each candidate. The goal of these conversations is to determine personality and whether this is someone who would do well with our church family.

After those two conversations, a single candidate should emerge for Faith Community Church.

I know that there has been a consistent call to prayer since we began this search. I, like many of you, have grown weary of the waiting and the pleading with the Lord for clarity and wisdom. As I write this to you, we do not have any names to pray over, or candidates to evaluate. We are in a time of waiting but have absolute assurance that our King remains on the throne and forever unchanged.

As we wait, allow me to share the hope found in Hebrews chapter 14: 14-16,

"Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has ascended into heaven,[a] Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin. Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need." (NIV)

Continue to pray with us in earnestness, even in our weariness. Our High Priest knows and understands, we must continue to cry out to Him who has made us right with God. By His Grace Alone!
