A MISSION UPDATE

Dear Faith Family,

One of my regular prayers for Faith Community Church is that God would allow us to be a Great Commission Church, and that He would use us to build his kingdom, here in New Richmond, but also around the world. And, God has been answering that prayer. I wish you could see all that I am seeing, so let me give you a short summary...

I also wanted to make you aware of what the Lord is doing in the realm of missions through FCC. As you know, we have renewed our historic partnership with Pastor Antonio and Guatemala. We also took on a new missionary from Spain, David Barcelo. David is a church planter, pastor, author and conference speaker who leads a church planting and revitalization effort in Spain and in Southwest Europe. We are so excited at what God is accomplishing in this brother.

Pastor Mike has successfully completed his work of raising up indigenous pastors with Training Leaders International. (We are working on having him come and share with us the incredible things God has done there.) But the mission team, with the blessing encouragement of the Elders, wants to maintain our connection with TLI as well as insure the continued advance of the gospel in Uganda.

So, Pastor Mike's financial support will continue to build on the ministries that he started. Funding will be repurposed to supporting TLI as well as financially supporting Pastor Edwin Onen. Pastor Edwin is a native Ugandan and one of Pastor Mike's best students. Pastor Edwin will continue Pastor Mike's ministry of training pastors in Uganda. He is also currently planting a church in the city of Kitgum.

Finally, the Lord has provided us with an incredible opportunity. Uganda borders the war-torn nation of South Sudan. In fact, some of the men that Pastor Mike trained were South Sudanese that fled from the civil war to Uganda.

One of the brothers, Pastor Taban Francis, has stepped forward and shared that he believes God is calling him to return to his homeland to share the training he has received with **three hundred pastors** that have had no training. What an amazing opening for the gospel. At the recommendation of the Missions Team, the Elders of Faith Community Church have agreed to support Pastor Taban's two-year mission to South Sudan.

That means that Faith Community Church is engaging in meaningful missions on three other continents. The gospel is going forward. Churches are being planted and strengthened. Pastors are being trained up for the ministry. God is doing amazing things!

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

Thank you FCC!

God's generosity poured out through attendees of FCC, community members, and other local churches with the collection of 1,522 shoebox gifts at FCC's drop-off location during National Collection Week. As a church, we packed, prayed and sent over 700 shoebox gifts that God will use as Gospel opportunities to open the doors to share the Good News of Jesus!

FCC serves our community during National Collection Week (NCW) as a drop-off location. Being a drop-off location gave the week's volunteers the opportunity to welcome individuals, groups, and other churches from New Richmond and our surrounding communities. We were privileged to lay hands of prayer on thousands of shoebox gifts and personal prayer requests from our shoebox donors. God provided plenty of relationship opportunities for our volunteers over the week and we are excited to see how He will continue to provide "this side of the box" stories.

It takes many hands to make the week run smoothly and successfully. This year, 29 volunteers shared the precious gift of their time as they served God through this ministry - serving a total of 256.5 hours all together!

FCC is one of 6 collection sites here in the Western Wisconsin OCC Area. The other drop off locations also serve their communities during NCW and bring their cartons of shoebox gifts to New Richmond on what is called "collection Monday" (the last Monday of NCW). Together, our Western Wisconsin area collected, prayed over and sent 12,155 shoebox gifts.

The generosity of our area is such a reflection of love for Christ and His people. The area team's goal was to collect 12,000 which was a God sized goal...only God could move in the hearts of His people and make this happen. What a great celebration of His presence and the power of this Gospel centered ministry.

These shoebox gifts will now travel to Aurora, Illinois where they will be carefully processed for international shipping. Next month, we'll share the destination countries and more information about the Gospel impact your shoebox gift has. A huge thank you to all that served to welcome donors with a smile and a prayer, the heavy lifters that loaded the semi-trailers, and those that spent their time flipping the foyer area back and forth from "church" mode to "collection site" mode.

In addition to packing a "regular" shoebox gift, you have an opportunity to pack and send shoebox gifts to Gospel sensitive/restrictive countries as well. If you missed the opportunity to participate in sending a shoebox gift, consider building one online. These are packed into non-ministry identifying plastic shoeboxes and sent to countries that currently restrict the Gospel from being shared, or countries with strict customs regulations.

He was telling me how he was starting to realize he needs to put his books down because he was always choosing his books over hanging out with his kids. He said he was sitting in his office, covered by his favorite knitted blanket as he read his book in beautiful silence, when he stated that, "God tapped me on the head." He heard his kids running around downstairs laughing loudly. At first he was irritated because he lost his spot. But then he realized he was missing out on his kids' joy.

He said he realized something in this moment: That one day he will have all the time in the world to sit and read his books because his house will be silent because his kids will be gone. And in those moments, he will be wishing he could experience their joy again.

If you want to see amazing joy, come and see what is happening on Wednesday nights. Last year we averaged around 69 students. This year we are consistently over 120. But, it is not just about the numbers. It is seeing the drive in these students to read their Bibles. They are also all eating a meal provided by the church and two amazing women cooking every week. I can't explain what a blessing it is to witness each and every week.

KIDZONE VOLUNTEER HIGHLIGHT

Meet Katy Everett

1. How long have you been serving in the Children's Ministry?

I have been consistently serving in Children's Ministry for 10 years but have been around it my entire life as my mom was a children's director. Here at FCC, I have had the privilege of serving for a little over 2 years.

2. Which position do you currently serve in?

I currently serve as the Children's Sunday School lead alongside Bobbi.

3. Why do you think Children's Ministry is important?

Children's Ministry is foundationally important for so many reasons. When as a child you are raised and brought up in an environment where students and adults outside of your family love the Lord and seek to make His name known, it carries an extra weight an impact, especially when families fail and life gets messy. I think we still don't, as people, realize how much our early childhood years shape the rest of our lives. We far too often underestimate a child's ability to understand and take ownership of their faith. We limit them, based on our exhaustion and limited capacities, instead of raising the bar, being faithful with the teaching and letting God be God. Statistically speaking, more people are saved under the age of 14 than not. However, even if those factors are ignored; Scripture repeatedly speaks about the importance of community with believers, the importance of children and of teaching Biblical truth. (Proverbs 22:6, Deuteronomy 6:6-7, Psalm 123:7, Matthew 19:14, Psalm 78:1-4, Matthew 18:20, Romans 10:17 and many more). Children's ministry is then, in my opinion: the physical act of affirming the Biblical truths that acknowledge children as active participants in God's plan. It is the process of shepherding and fostering children's faith and aiding in solidifying their identity beyond the temporal, thereby giving them the tools to take ownership and thrive in a broken world. In my opinion, children's ministry is foundational kingdom work and absolutely of vital and time sensitive importance. I believe the support of it is the calling of every believer.



4. What would you tell people that might be considering serving with our children/youth?

Simply put. DO IT. Now more than ever our young people are crying out to be seen, heard and loved. We too often put pressure on ourselves to be perfect when we step into serving, thinking we need to be a certain way and honestly its just not truth. We have a responsibility to behave in a manner that honors the Lord and is consistent with Scripture, yes but how many times are the standards we hold ourselves to culturally based or man made. In ministry, you aren't alone. You simply need to step out and show up, we help with the rest. Its not as scary as it seems and we are with you and for you every step of the way. You don't need all the answers or unlimited availability, just a willing heart. These kids need more God fearing, loving adults in their life. And the cool part? They will love & teach you as much as you love & teach them

5. Funniest child quote you've heard while serving:

Our missions Sundays always bring up the funniest comments from our kiddos as they realize the world is much bigger than they thought. I can't remember a specific quote from FCC right now but one of my most memorable quotes I have ever been asked was from a 3/4yr old and it was if the Apostle Paul ever went to Atahala. Like from Disney's Frozen 2, Atahala. It was pretty adorable.




