DEAR CHURCH FAMILY

We recently had our quarterly Covenant Member meeting. We got to hear so much encouraging news! God has been incredibly gracious to FCC. I would like to share some of the highlights for those who were unable to join us.

First, we brought twenty-one new people into membership this Sunday during worship. We should not measure success in numbers, but in faithfulness to Christ. Membership in the local church is a mark of faithfulness where the individual Christian chooses to stand up and identify him or herself with the people of God. He or she is saying they want to be part of the larger ministry of the church and wish to be held accountable to their profession of faith; and twenty-one people took that step. Praise God He is growing our membership!

Second, the Lord has provided us with a new Youth Pastor. Michael Hedges, who recently came to us from our sister church, The Bridge in Somerset, has felt the calling of the Lord to serve our youth at FCC. This is a significant answer to the prayer request I shared at the last covenant member meeting. I have gotten to know Michael, love his heart for our students, and am excited to work alongside him and support him in this new role.

Third, the Lord has raised up Jim Ruhl to serve as our new Deacon of Men's Ministry. Jim's desire is to build up the men of FCC to maturity in Christ. I was particularly heartened by his vision of ministering to the young men in the church, even young boys who do not have a father in the home. Jim has a pastoral heart and I look forward to seeing how God will use him in the future of our church.

Fourth, when I first arrived at FCC in October of last year, we only had two Elders: Steve Langer and Randy Kostroski. They were soon joined by Bryan Stangl. Those men have labored week after week to care for the membership here. I am so thankful for them. The Lord has recently raised up two more men who aspire to the position of Elders of FCC: Paul Olsen and Zac Evans. This is an incredible blessing. If the Lord wills, we could have as many as six Elders by the end of the year!

Fifth, at the last Covenant Member Meeting, Steve Langer informed the church that Sonshine Learning Center, which rents the South wing of the building, had decided to construct their own building. They will be moving out on July 27, 2024 into their own space to further their business. If the Lord wills, our plan is to love Sonshine well as they leave and assist them in their move. More on that to come. Next, our desire is to renovate the South wing of the church over the course of the month of August in order to allow us to provide Sunday school classes for adults and students of all ages in the Fall. Our goal in this is to evangelize our kids and grow deeper in Christ as a congregation. While this means some changes for us all, the FCC Staff, Elders and Ministry Team firmly believe the Lord is leading us in this direction and we are so excited to have this opportunity to offer new ways for us to grow as a church.

These are some pretty exciting updates! I am not writing this to brag, but to celebrate what God is doing in and for us here at FCC. Would you help me in giving thanks to Him for all that He has done for us? Next, would you continue to keep FCC in your prayers? We need God's strength and wisdom to continue to be faithful.

Moreover, this renovation and overhaul of our ministries will require a tremendous amount of commitment from the whole church. Would you please pray and consider how the Lord is calling you to contribute your time, talent and treasure for His glory? Stay tuned for specific ways you can serve this Summer.

Finally, whenever the Lord is at work, evil is never very far behind seeking to destroy it. In love and humility, would you join us in pursuing the unity of the church? Most importantly would you pray as we press into Christ? Jesus said, "I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing"





INTRODUCING MICHAEL HEDGES Our New Youth Pastor

Hey, I'm Michael, and I am the new youth pastor at FCC. My wife, kids and I have been coming to FCC for about 8 months. Before that we were a part of the Bridge Bible Church in Somerset. I am an ordained minister with Converge, have a masters of divinity from Sioux Falls Seminary, and I am a full-time hospice chaplain.

Taking on this new role isn't just about me leading a group of kids, it is about changing the culture of the church to be invested in the youth. We live in a world with an identity crisis, even as adults. For Christians, our identity is in Christ and our value is in the love that God has for us when he sent Jesus to die on the cross for our sins. But, the truth is, kids are looking for validation, and if they don't get it from the Word, they'll look for it somewhere else – and we won't like where they find it.

Let me give you an example: A couple months ago Pastor Peter was teaching a class about the minor prophets. I started going with my son and at first, he didn't like going. It wasn't because of Peter's teaching; the class was just not something he naturally wanted to do on a Tuesday night. I didn't really blame him since he was the youngest one in the class, but he still followed along, paid attention and gained knowledge about the minor prophets. This was in large part because of the other adult members of the class and how they invested in his life.

Some of the other attendees would bring cookies or snacks, and at the end of class they would tell my son that he could take the leftovers home. What teenager doesn't want free food?? Not only that, but on Sunday mornings these same people would come up and ask him, "How's it going?", "Are you keeping your dad on track?", "What did you learn this week in class?" These people would check in with my son and ask how he was doing and I could see how that changed him. It helped him to believe that he is valued, and helped him know that he wasn't just part of the class, he was part of the church as a whole.

Our youth are not just a group of kids who attend youth group on Wednesday nights, they are people that we get to love on like Christ, teach them about God, and show them what a church family looks like. We need to learn their names. We need to remember that they had a math test coming up and ask them how they did when we see them the following Sunday. We get to pursue them and ask how they're doing, so that they believe that they have value and are loved in a place that seeks truth in God's word.

WHAT WE HAVE BEEN UP TO

From the Elders

As the elders of Faith Community Church, we have been entrusted with the "noble task" (1 Tomothy 3:1) of caring for the church of God (Acts 20:28–31). To fulfill this responsibility, we pray daily through a portion of the membership list. During our weekly elder meetings, we focus on a specific section to ensure the well-being of each member and their family. We also assign an elder to personally reach out to members, to know how we can specifically pray for them, and to reach out to any members who may be drifting away.

At our weekly elder meetings, we've been quite occupied conducting membership interviews. When someone shows interest in becoming a member, they attend a membership class and then receive an interview by the elder council. Our goal is to ensure that new members of Faith Community Church have a clear understanding of the Gospel of Jesus and are devoted to actively and consistently participating in the daily life of a Christ follower. We also enjoy the chance to get to know them.

We have also had the opportunity to interview individuals who have shown interest in getting baptized. Once they express their interest and attend a brief class, we invite them to an elder meeting where we ask a series of questions to ensure they fully understand the significance and purpose of baptism, and celebrate these next steps.

These are examples of some of the ways that the elders are working to shepherd, teach, and protect the flock that has been entrusted to us here at Faith Community Church.

We currently have two men, Zac Evans and Paul Olsen, who are exploring the possibility of serving as elders at FCC. They are actively participating in meetings, praying, caring for members, and evaluating whether they are being called by God to serve in this role. Please keep them in your prayers as they go through this process.





GLOBAL MISSIONS TEAM REPORT

The Global Missions Team has been working behind the scenes for the past year to build a solid foundation for future missions at Faith Community Church. Here are some of the core values in missions we want to see come alive at Faith Community Church.

Missions that engage the church:

Our desire is to find missions endeavors and activities that have the potential to engage our entire church body with their unique gifts and abilities through prayer, encouragement, projects, mentoring, and giving. The Bibles FCC purchased to give to people in Uganda, and the dedication cards our church body recently completed for the Pastors in Uganda, are great examples of this kind of involvement.

Missions that are gospel-focused and make disciples:

We want to be sure that our missions endeavors line up with FCC's core value of "Making Disciples Who Plant The Church". We are looking for missions opportunities where the focus is sharing the gospel and making disciples, and the projects and activities of the mission should support this goal.

Missions that emphasize partnership:

Faith Community will be partnering with a variety of missions endeavors with the priority being creating meaningful, long-term (multi-year) partnerships with a small number of missions endeavors and organizations. We would rather go "deep" than "wide" to facilitate deeper, more meaningful relationships with those we partner with. We want names to be recognized, places to be known, ministry efforts to be prayed for, needs to be understood, and a passion to grow for the people our missions partners are working with.

We have a great start as a church with the Bibles and dedication cards that were sent to the Pastors in Uganda. This was a great opportunity to bless these men and their efforts. We are also excited to announce that we have identified our first Partnership Mission with Vida Real Church in Guatemala, and Vida Real's pastor and church-planter, Pastor Antonio. Several years ago, Faith Community participated in numerous short-term trips to support this ministry. However, we will be moving toward a new, deeper, ongoing partnership with regular communication about ministry and prayer needs.

We hope to learn from each other as we work to advance the Gospel in Guatemala. Faith Community will also be financially supporting Vida Real ministry on a monthly basis.



OGG WATCH PARTY

Faith Community was one of 500 nationwide locations for an Operation Christmas Child year-round volunteer area team watch party. The team heard amazing stories of God's provision and incredible future plans.

80% of all decisions for Christ happen before the age of 15 and 25% of the world's population (almost 2 billion people) are under the age of 15. Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes are going into Ethiopia for the first time this year where there are 44 million children under 15 years old. Shoeboxes will once again go to Nigeria which has 80 million children 15 and under. The fields are ready for harvest!

The Greatest Journey 12-lesson discipleship program has been translated into Braille and a pilot program

to begin in the Philippines and Togo this year; and new materials for deaf children have been developed.





welcome team

WE ARE ALL THE WELGOME TEAM

The Welcome and Hospitality Team is made up of about 50 people. We greet at the doors, inside and out, we answer questions at the Connection Point, and we make and clean up the coffee. We are a wonderful team of people who love to serve God and our faith family. It has been my privilege to work with them. But church, I want to say, we are all on the welcome team. We all have the job of making our church a welcoming place for every guest. Our God is a hospitable God. He generously welcomed us into his family. We want to reflect the hospitality of God as we welcome guests who visit our church. Can you remember a time when you started a new job, or moved to a new location, or started attending a new school or church? You might walk into that situation, and nothing is familiar, and you do not know anyone. You might feel self-conscious or a little uncomfortable or lonely, even though you are in a crowd. What can make you feel welcome and included? It is when someone approaches you with a and says something like, "Hi! I'm ____, what's your name?" A simple introduction and a few friendly questions can help you connect with a guest and help them feel welcome and cared for. A great way to help someone feel connected is to learn and remember their name. We had a team meeting last month and did a training on remembering names. I have included that information below. What makes a welcoming church? Not just those people who are standing at the doors or handing out bulletins, but everyone.

Tips for Remembering Names

Making the effort to remember someone's name is a simple, yet profound way, to show someone you care.

1.Active Listening

When you are meeting someone for the first time, invest yourself in the introduction. Be present, aware, and give them your full attention, actively listening to the person in front of you.

2. 3 Times Rule

Try to either repeat their name three times in the conversation, repeat the name to another person right after the introduction, or repeat the name three times to yourself.

"I don't think I've met you."

"Hi, I'm Sue"

"Hi Sue, it's nice to meet you. I'm _____"

"Have you been coming to Faith Community Church for long, Sue?"

"I'm visiting for the first time today"

"Before you leave today Sue, make sure you stop by the Connection Point to get more information about the church."

4. Visual Connection

Look at the person you are meeting and take a mental photo of them. Is there a feature, hair color, resemblance, or rhyme that you can connect with the person's appearance and or name? The more outrageous the connection, the easier it will be to remember the name.

5. How do you spell that?

If it is an unusual name, ask how it is spelled and repeat the spelling. This might also help you in making a visual connection.

6. Write It

Write the name as soon as you part ways, and some notes about your visual connection.

7. I Forgot!

If you do forget somebody's name, and sometimes we will, admit to them that you need a reminder the very next time you speak to the person. Nothing is worse than going weeks speaking with someone and not knowing their name because we are embarrassed to ask.

APPARENT PRIVILEGE

Far too many of us Christian parents are unaware of the great responsibility and privilege God has placed squarely on our shoulders. He has given to us the main duty of spiritually discipling our own children, something that ought not to be left to the "professionals". God's design in parenting is all the more sobering in a world that no longer acknowledges absolute truth. Children are desperate for sound guidance from their parents.

"Apparent Privilege" by Steve Wright does a wonderful job explaining what can happen when parents don't take this command seriously, giving a biblical view of what nurturing and protecting your child looks like and offering practical ways to go about this task. Using stats, studies and lots of Scripture, this book is a short, to-the-point read.


I believe chapter 3, entitled "A Parent's Understanding: A Theology of Family" was worth reading the book alone. Wright says,

God does not change. His Word does not fluctuate with the times. His truths that guide our families are enduring, unshakable, and trustworthy. We need to think about family like God thinks about family.

This chapter consists of 7 foundations of the family – "bedrock truths God gives us in His Word that will stand strong through all of life's storms".

There is also a valuable chapter on the local church's role as a partner in parenting and an encouraging chapter on the specific call of a father. Alongside other great parenting resources such as JC Ryle's "The Duties of Parents" – which Wright quotes from – this book will be a great benefit to parents and even youth leaders.


BAPTISMS
