QUARTERLY REPORT

As Shared at our August 17, 2025 Covenant Member Meeting

Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth. 2 Timothy 2:15

In his second letter to the young pastor in Ephesus, Paul instructs Timothy to do his best to present himself as to God as one approved. The New Living Translation renders it "Work hard so you can present yourself to God and receive his approval..." The King James translates it, "Study to shew thyself approved unto God..." The point remains the same. Anyone who works for Christ should not be apathetic with their level of service. We should be constantly growing and striving for improvement so that when we stand before the Lord we have nothing to be ashamed of. When it comes my time, I want to be able to say, "Lord, I left it all on the field. Yet not I, but Christ in me." I hope that is your desire and driving passion as well.

Pastors are particularly accountable for our preaching and teaching of the word of God. I believe there is no higher calling, but that calling also comes with a high accountability. But James 3:1 says, "Not many of you should become teachers, my brothers, for you know that we who teach will be judged with greater strictness." I take that warning seriously. One of the most fundamental tasks of a lead pastor is to faithfully, clearly and passionately preach and teach the word of God to the people of God. In John 21, when Jesus restores the Apostle Peter to ministry, he commands him to "feed my sheep." If a man will not or cannot do that, he is spiritually injuring the sheep in his church. It's why Paul commands Timothy to "rightly handle the word of truth." It is my sincere endeavor to rightly handle the word of truth week in and week out for the glory of God and the good of his people.



This Fall we will be resuming our study of the book of Matthew on Sunday mornings. There is such a depth to the teaching of Jesus in this Gospel, I hope you are able to join us as we dive into the riches of Christ.

At the direction of the Elders, I have also begun a Leadership Development class during the Sunday School period. This class of fifteen members is walking through Wayne Grudem's book "Bible Doctrines". The goal of the class is not simply to relay systematic theology, but examine how biblical truth is meant to shape the way we lead our lives, our families and our church. My hope is to continue teaching this class every year to raise up leaders for Faith Community and the Kingdom of Christ.

I have also endeavored to increase my own growth to better serve you at FCC. I want to express my gratitude for the church allowing me to attend a week intensive course on biblical Greek at my old seminary. I pray my studies will hone my understanding of the word of God so that I am able to faithfully serve you for years to come.

Let me conclude by sharing how thankful I am for the wisdom of the Elders, the faithful service of the Ministry Team (deacons) and the passion for excellence of the staff. I am truly privileged to be part of such an amazing team. I consider myself immeasurably blessed to be a part of Faith Community Church. I sincerely look forward to continuing to serve here for many years, and I am excited for all that God has in store for us.





Why True Woman 101 Matters

Lately, I've found myself wrestling with questions: Why this study? Why now? The world feels loud and confusing, and honestly, so does my own heart some days. As women, we're constantly navigating expectations—at home, at work, in ministry, in culture. We're told to be strong but gentle, bold but agreeable, ambitious but self-sacrificing. And in the middle of it all, we're trying to hold onto our faith, care for our families, and make sense of who we are.

I've felt it myself—those moments when I'm juggling the needs of my family, caring for my aging dad, managing the home, and trying to be present for others. It's easy to lose sight of the truth: that I am created in God's image. That I have worth and purpose not because of what I do, but because of who He is. And yet, that truth gets buried under the weight of daily life. That's why this study matters. I need the reminder. We all do.

That's why we're gathering for True Woman 101. Not to add one more thing to your already full plate, but to create space—space to breathe, reflect, and remember who God says we are. This isn't about perfect attendance or having all the answers. It's about coming together, opening Scripture, and letting God reshape our understanding of womanhood, identity, and purpose.



Whether you're in a season of caregiving, career shifts, parenting challenges, or spiritual dryness, you're not alone. We'll walk through this study side by side—laughing, praying, learning, and sometimes just showing up tired but willing. And in that space, God meets us. He reminds us that we are fearfully and wonderfully made, called to reflect His beauty and truth in a world that desperately needs it.

So if your soul feels weary, your schedule feels full, or your identity feels a little lost in the shuffle—this is your invitation. True Woman 101 begins September 10 and runs for nine weeks, with morning and evening sessions available to fit your schedule. Then in November, we'll continue the conversation with a women-only adult Sunday School class, diving deeper into the lies women believe and the truths found in Scripture. You don't have to come with everything figured out—just come ready to grow, reflect, and be reminded of who you are in Christ.





TLI INTERNATIONAL

TLI International and their work at the Pastoral Training Center at Abaana's Hope, in Gulu, Uganda.

FCC has financially supported Mike Evans, of TLI International, for the past several years. Three times each year, for more than a decade, pastors from here in the St. Croix Valley area have traveled to Gulu, Uganda to teach African pastors how to understand and communicate God's Word. Through this discipleship, multiplication has occurred and this past August, two pastor graduates from the TLI training in Gulu, Pastors Okello Benson, and Olara Sunday traveled to Kenya to begin training Kenyan Pastors.

On September 13, 2025, there will be a celebration halfway around the world as the current two cohorts totaling 82 men are scheduled to graduate! This will also be the point at which future training will continue under an African leadership team. God has produced amazing fruit! Since the beginning of this partnership, Mike, Larry, Stu, Peter among a few others, have taught and led over 150 church leaders through the TLI training program.

FEED MY LAMBS INTERNATIONAL

Los Canelos, Mexico

When you sign up for a mission trip to an unfamiliar place, you expect to experience moments "out of your comfort zone". God uses these moments to stretch us, grow us in our faith, and build a deeper reliance on Him. Imagine a mission trip lasting 21 years...Gary Sandmann, a missionary pastor in Mexico, lives out that experience and yet, he remains faithful and committed to God's calling on his life.

Gary misses living in Wisconsin, but he loves his wife, his children, and his extended family in Mexico. Gary hates the heat, yet he toils each day to bring glory and honor to God as he completes the physical work projects God calls him to complete currently the expansion of the ministry center's church.

An introvert by nature called into the vocation of ministry. A vocation requiring an extrovert, through the continuous service to others in an unfamiliar country, with an unfamiliar language - yet he faithfully answered the call on his life. Gary doesn't have to imagine what Nehemiah and Noah felt, and Paul's relationship with Philippi; Gary knows, he feels it, he lives it.



Feed My Lambs International was birthed with Gary's faithful response to God's call on his life. Gary and his wife, Minnie, have a ministry center in Los Canelos, Mexico, which facilitates Christ centered children's camps, pastoral retreats, provides a "safe" space for area churches to conduct their own children's camps/events, and hosts special holiday events. Their ministry also supports the "Milagro de Vida Casa Hogar" (Miracle of Life Foster Home) Cuernavaca, currently run by Minnie's sister, Betty, and her husband, Pastor Chayo.

A young boy, living at Milagro de Vida, shared with Pastor Chayo that a predator had told him "Go ahead and scream. No one will hear your cries". Pastor Chayo replied, "God hears".

Why does Gary continue to loyally serve endures while he uncomfortable"? Because, to Gary's ears, the sound of their cries is deafening.

How then are they to call on Him in whom they have not believed? How are they to believe in Him of whom they have not heard? And how are they to hear without a preacher? Romans 10:14

Through Gary's faithful serving, he has experienced the joy of bearing witness to how God cares, loves and redeems.

Our FCC Mission Team has sent financial support to the Feed My Lambs International ministry, and we will continue to explore other ways to support Gary's ministry in the future.

Book Recommendation

"SURVIVING RELIGION 101:

Letters to a Christian Student on Keeping the Faith in College

"We must remember that Christianity is worthy of our belief not because it always feels better—or even seems to work better than other systems—but because it is true. If Jesus is really the Son of God, if he really rose from the dead, if there really is eternal life only through him, then that is enough to make him worthy of following."

"Surviving Religion 101: Letters to a Christian Student on Keeping the Faith in College" by Michael Kruger is a book that I wish I had when I was younger. Kruger is a professor at Reformed Theological Seminary and the father of three children. He has written many heady theology books but the nagging thought to write a "laylevel book" for Christian college students wouldn't leave. When his oldest daughter, Emma, got accepted into the same secular university that he attended as an undergraduate, he decided it was time to write.

Kruger noticed a problem within evangelicalism. "The frequency with which Christian students head off to college and return (often in a short time) with a substantially different worldview than when they left...It might be time for a new doctrinal-theological-intellectual


awakening in which the church recaptures her rich heritage of the Christian mind – and then considers various ways to pass that heritage down to the next generation." He hopes this book will better prepare children for the flood of "intellectual attacks they will receive from their professors, classmates and campus organizations".

The 16 chapters of this book are written as letters to Kruger's daughter, each covering a different topic. Some of the titles are: "My Professors Are Really Smart – Isn't It More Likely That They're Right and I'm Wrong?", "My Christian Morals Are Viewed as Hateful and Intolerant – Shouldn't I Be More Loving and Accepting?" and "Sometimes It Feels Like My Faith Is Slipping Away – How Do I Handle Doubts about What I Believe?".

Kruger has a way of teaching without the reader realizing they are learning in-depth apologetics. His writing is so easy to understand. Because he is writing to his daughter, there is genuine compassion in his tone and honesty in acknowledging the doubts that can creep into the mind of believers as we encounter seemingly clever non-Christian arguments.

I strongly recommend this book. I have already given two as graduation gifts and one to my own son. Don't limit this to only college students. Older high schoolers, youth pastors, youth leaders, parents should all read this book. Even better - study it together.



Christianity Explored


This study of the Gospel of Mark seeks to answer three life-impacting questions:

RECOMMENDED CHANGES

Change for the sake of change is rarely a good idea, at least in my short sixty-some odd years of experience. Sometimes changes can happen without actually changing anything. Case in point: in January the elders met for an annual planning meeting and identified specific goals for the current year. One rather significant goal, in addition to hiring an Associate Pastor and focusing on training up leaders in the church, is to clarify Faith Community Church's primary documents. Those being our Church Covenant, Statement of Faith and our Constitution. Though some of the phraseology in those documents has changed, the purpose, content and intent have remained the same. The intent of the changes in wording is simply to clarify those things which needed to be expressed more completely to avoid any misunderstanding at a time in our culture when words seem to have lost much of their meaning.

So, with all that as introduction, the Elders are putting forward recommended changes to the Statement of Faith, Church Covenant and Constitution. These recommendations come after much prayer, counsel, discussion and consideration. We are asking you, the covenant members of Faith Community Church, to read through these documents with the changes added as annotations. This way, any questions or concerns may be addressed before you are asked to vote to approve the changes in December of this year. We will be having opportunities for question-and-answer forums for the entire congregation in the coming months, and we want to hear from you. If you have questions or any concerns, please come and talk to us.

Let us share with you why we made the recommendations that we did.

Church Covenant

- 1. The major recommended change is the addition of an introductory paragraph to explain that the reason we covenant together is because we are Christians. We want to make it clear that if you become a member of FCC without first becoming a Christian, you have completely missed the point, and we have not done our jobs.
- 2. The second recommended change, you will notice is that we changed the covenant commitment from "I" to "we." It's important that members understand that they are not blindly pledging their allegiance to some institution, but rather, we are making a commitment to one another out of Christian love.
- 3. Third, we are recommending the sentence, "...By prioritizing gathering together for corporate worship on the Lord's Day." We want to stress the importance of gathering for worship. Currently we have people that call this their church home but have not worshipped with us in two years. It's hard to say you are committed to a church you never attend and it's hard to love people that you don't make a priority.
 - a. We recognize there are times when people can't make it for one reason or another. And there may be times when someone is physically unable to come to worship anymore. But those are exceptions that prove the rule. And we believe that in those extreme cases the church has a responsibility to those people. So, if they can't go to church, the church goes to them.
- 4. The final recommended change to the church covenant is the sentence "By faithful participation in our local community." To "By being salt and light as we participate in our local community." The truth is the church has grown, and we have people coming from outside of New Richmond. We thought it would be best to use biblical language to say that where God has you living you are called to live in a way that represents Jesus.



From the Elders

Statement of Faith

- 1. Aside from a few clarifying sentences, the major recommended changes to the statement of faith have to do with marriage, gender and sexuality. This is not a change to our belief system. If you read the Elder position statements you will see that all the Elders and Pastors hold to these doctrines. But simply because the world is becoming more confused on these issues, we want to provide biblical clarity in love.
- 2.We believe that God creates people as men or women. We believe that both men and women are created in the image of God and endowed with equal value and inherent dignity.
- 3.We believe that the Bible teaches that while men and women are equal in value given us different complementary roles to fulfill.
- 4. We believe that Marriage is the lifelong union between one man and one woman.

Church Constitution

- When it comes to church membership, we want to accomplish two things.
 - We want to clarify what membership is and what is expected. Membership, in a nutshell, is community, commitment and accountability.
 - Second, we wanted to empower the congregation to fulfill its God given role to be the people of God.
 - i.That includes voting to approve their leadership. We see example of this in Acts 6:3.
 - ii. We believe it's important that the church has a say in its leadership.
 - iii.We believe this will grow trust between the leadership and the congregation.
- Second, we want to apply biblical categories and wisdom to the roles of the positions in the church.
 - a.So, we used to use the phrase "the management team" when speaking about the deacons as a group.
 - i. But we want to acknowledge that this is a biblical role with biblical requirements. And the deacons felt that the term "ministry team" better encapsulated what they are all about.
- We are recommending terms for both elders and deacons
 - So an elder or a deacon will agree to serve for a three-year term. And if they want to extend their term, and the church affirms them, they can serve another term of up to three more years, for a total of six years. But after six years they are required to step down for a year and rest.
 - We believe this will better protect our leaders from burnout.

Thank you all for being committed members of FCC who, through your diligence to remain faithful to the Gospel, wish to see God glorified in all we do. As the writer of Hebrews admonishes: "Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful."
